

We look forward to revealing (when it is finally decided!) what 2025 will





Year 11 VCD Excursion

11 VCD Excursion to the Sun Theatre and NGV Australia

On Monday, July 22nd, our Year 11 Visual Communication Design students, went on an excursion to conduct field research and get inspired for Unit 2!

We began by visiting The Sun Theatre in Yarraville, an excellent example of Art Deco architecture. As part of Unit 2 Outcome 1, students are tasked with designing a theatre club lounge for this beautifully restored cinema, which was first constructed in 1938. To begin their research, they were given special early access to take site photos and explore every area of the cinema before it was opened to the public that day.

A major highlight of the visit was a private screening of footage documenting the theatres restoration before watching "Inside Out 2," which added a touch of movie magic to their research day. The students were all impressed by The Sun Theatre's unique style and how the restoration has incorporated local history into the design concept.

After the site visit, the group caught the train to the National Gallery of Victoria - Ian Potter Centre to explore Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander art and design. Here, the students viewed a variety of artworks and learned about symbols and iconography that will inspire them for Unit 2 Outcome 2. The gallery visit inspired students and enriched their understanding of First Nations perspectives in design.

Overall, the excursion gave our students tons of inspiration and practical experience that they'll include in their design portfolios.

A huge thank you to The Sun Theatre for their warm welcome and support. We're looking forward to seeing how these experiences will influence our students' designs






National Science Week

Year 12 - VTAC Information

Year 12 - What is VTAC?

The Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre is a hub where students apply for courses through TAFE, polytechnics and university. This includes Cert IV, Diplomas, Associate Degrees and Bachelor Degrees. They don't decide who gets into the course, they only facilitate the application process.



There are key deadlines for all Year 12 students to pay attention to:

Key Dates *	
29 July 2024	VTAC applications open (Fee-\$60)
30 September (5pm)	VTAC applications close (Fees increase to \$150 after this date)
11 October (5pm)	SEAS and Scholarships close
12 December (7am)	VCE results and ATARs available to applicants
23 December (10am)	December offer round - Domestic
10 January 2025 (2pm)	January offer round one - Domestic

These dates are taken from the VTAC.edu.au website

Due to the complex nature of applications, some offers (like Medical entry and Acting) will only make an offer to students in January.

Some courses (like Architecture and Design) require a portfolio to be submitted and a selection task to be completed. Most of these **selection tasks** are released in July and students have 4-8 weeks to complete them. These tasks may be in addition to the presentation of their folios and interviews.

Where to look for courses?

Students are encouraged to visit the **Open Days** conducted by various universities in Term 3 (August-September) and use VTAC's CourseSearch (www.vtac.edu.au/coursesearch) feature to understand the courses and their pre-requisites for entry.

If students require a hard copy of a University's Course Guide, please visit the Careers Office. Note that these guides are limited!

University Open Days - 2024

Getting the most out of an Open Day

Most institutional Open Days are held in late July and August (see over the page for Open Day dates). However, you are more than welcome to contact an institution to arrange a visit any time

What happens on an Open Day?

On Open Day you can visit an institution when it's at its best. Everyone is there – academics, lecturers, current students, and information officers. More importantly, you can talk with academics, lecturers, and current students about what certain courses are actually like, and what is required to get into them.

Who should attend an Open Day?

Anyone who is considering studying at a tertiary level in the next few years should attend.

Why should you attend an Open Day?

Apart from the opportunity to obtain course information there are many other reasons why attending an Open Day is a good idea:

You are going to feel more comfortable arriving at a university or TAFE institute on the first day of classes if you have been there before.

What is really involved in the course or courses you are interested in?

If you have to move away from home, where are you going to live?

Will you be happier studying in a large metropolitan institution or a smaller, perhaps rural institution?

What does the place 'feel' like? Is it a bustling environment with lots of activity or a quieter, more relaxed campus set in landscaped grounds?

How are you going to get there? Is it close to public transport or should you start saving now for a car? If you don't know the answers to any of these questions, then you should attend an Open Day!

How to make the best of Open Days

To make your Open Day visits fun and informative, here are some pointers:

Write down a list of questions you would like to ask about particular courses.

Be there early. Crowds tend to develop as the day progresses.

On arrival, get a map from a central point and ask for directions to the relevant faculties or schools.

Ask questions!

Don't spend the day collecting printed information only. Use the opportunity to speak directly with academics before applications close.

Introduce yourself to selection officers if you feel it is appropriate, but don't be pushy.

Check out the residential colleges, if available. After all, it is you that will be living there.

Walk around the campus. Have a good look! See what sporting facilities and other services are available.

Enjoy the visit!
